1. Details of previous sailing/rowing experience; including dates of activities, type of boat used, competition status, coaching, administrative experience, etc:

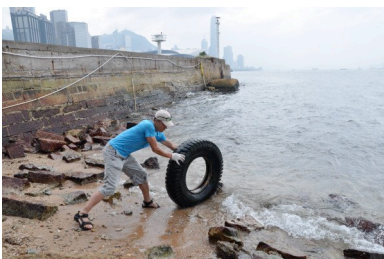
I am an active and proud member of the Royal X-Men dragon boat team. I had taken a summer-long introductory course to sea rowboat while I was still in Vancouver, but was a novice to dragon boat when I joined the X-Men. I started training with the team in January 2010, and had my first races in May. During these few months, I was busy wrapping up my Doctor of Engineering studies and raising a one year-old boy, but did take part in as many training sessions as I could. I enjoyed both Saturdays' "wet" sessions at Middle Island, and Wednesdays' circuits behind the gym at Kellett Island. Through these trainings, I gained both the necessary skills and strengths to become an effective member of the team. I also get to enjoy tremendously the welcoming atmosphere and comradeship that the team and the Club have to offer.

I was part of the X-Men and X-Mixed teams at the Deep Water Bay Dragon Boat Races on May 9th, the Lamma 500 Dragon Boat Festival on May 16th, and the Stanley Warm Up Races on May 21st. I was fully prepared to be part of the team again at the Mui Wu Dragon Boat Race, and the Stanley Internationals on June 13th and 16th respectively. I was, however, notified of some family issues on June 9th, so ended up flying to Vancouver on the 11th, and therefore missed the season finale. I also co-owned a powered pleasure craft at the time, but I enjoyed my time on the sailboat much, much more.
